


Top Tips:

- 1. When filling the Christmas tree, start with longer stitches in the centre and use shorter stitches towards the edges for a natural, layered effect. This technique helps create a smooth, dimensional look and ensures the dark green stitches (added afterwards) blend well on top.
- 2. When stitching the coats, work satin stitches in one direction per section to ensure even coverage and a polished finish.
- 3. When stitching hat bobbles, use 2 strands to achieve well-defined and plump French knots. Position them directly at the top of each hat.

- 1. Using 1 strand of grass green thread, stitch the Christmas tree with **long** and **short stitches**. Once filled, use 1 strand of dark green thread to add small **straight stitches** over the top and along the edges.
- 2. With 1 strand of dark brown thread, stitch the sledge with straight stitches.
- 3.Stitch all of the coats in **satin stitch** using 1 strand of each thread colour. Refer to the guide for colour placement.
- 4.Next, stitch all of the scarves using 1 strand of thread in **split stitch**.
- 5. Stitch all of the hats in **straight stitch** using 1 strand of thread. Then using 2 strands, stitch the hat bobbles with 1 **French knot** each.
- 6. Stitch on the gloves using 1 strand of the colour (use guide for reference) with 2-3 **straight stitches**.
- 7. Stitch all of the trousers using the stitch guide for reference on colour and stitch.
- 8.Next, stitch all of the boots using 1 strand of each colour in **satin stitch**.
- 9. For the skin, use 1 strand of either pale pink or pale brown thread and stitch in **satin stitch**.
- 10. Finish by stitching the girl's hair using 1 strand of dark brown thread and stitch the snowball with 1 strand of white thread in **satin stitch**.
