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Tension

16 stitches and 17 rows (4 inch square) with the double crochet stitch 5.5mm hook.

Measurements

Size: approx. 135cm x 130cm (53"x 51")

Abbreviations (UK Terms)

Ch- Chain

Sl st - Slip stitch

Dc - Double crochet

Htr - Half treble crochet

Tr - Treble crochet

Inc - Increase stitch

BLO - Back loop only

FLO - Front loop only

Bbl - Bobble stitch

Dc spike-st - Double crochet spike

stitch

Bptr – Back post treble stitch

Fptr - Front post treble stitch

Leaf – Leaf stitch

FO - Fasten off

() – Stitches in same stitch

Special Stitches

Bbl -Bobble Stitch - WS facing

[YO, insert hook, yarn over, pull through] 4 times, 9 loops on your hook, YO and pull through all loops on your hook.

Dc Spike Stitch

A variation on a double crochet stitch – It uses the same steps as a double crochet stitch, but instead of working into the current row where you are crocheting, you drop down 2 rows. You always draw the yarn up so that the top of the stitch is still exactly where the top would be if this were a normal double crochet stitch.

Back Post Treble Stitch - bptr

Yo, insert hook around post of next st from back to front. YO, pull the yarn back through all the spaces, you should now have 3 loops on your hook, YO, pull hook through 2 loops, you should now have 2 loops on your hook, YO, pull hook through last 2 loops.

Front Post Treble Stitch - fptr

Yo, insert hook around post of next st from front to back to front again. YO, yarn over again, using your hook pull the yarn back through the spaces, you will now have 3 loops on your hook, YO, pull the yarn through two loops using your hook, you will now have two loops on your hook, yarn over, and pull yarn through last two remaining loops.


Leaf Stitch

You make the stitch in the double crochet two rows below (see pics below) – Yarn over (image 1), insert hook 2 rows below, bringing the post of the double crochet forward (image 2), yarn over (image 3), pull through, now you have 3 loops on your hook (image 4), yarn over (image 5), insert hook through same stitch as before (image 6), yarn over (image 7), pull through, now 5 loops on your hook (image 8), yarn over (image 9), pull through first 4 loops (image 10), yarn over (image 11), pull through last 2 loops (image 12). NOTE this is for the first row, 2nd row onwards you will be doing the stitch around a tr not a dc.

Tapestry Crochet Technique

The Toadstool and Pumpkin are made using tapestry crochet. You are going to use different colours, and you will carry the additional yarn along with you and work over it as you crochet the row. You only need to carry the yarn you use for the "background" and cut the yarn when it is no longer needed.

Intarsia Crochet Technique

Intarsia crochet is similar to tapestry crochet except the unused yarns are not carried with the current yarn. Instead, the yarn is dropped (but not cut) at the back of your work and picked up again when next needed. You can carry the main background colour on each row.

Colour Change Method Used for Tapestry Crochet

Stop crocheting right before the you pull through the last 2 loops on your hook. Drop the colour you are using and put the new colour yarn on your hook and pull the new colour through the last 2 stitches on your hook, then carry the old colour under your stitches.

Colour Change Method Used for Intarsia Crochet

Stop crocheting right before you pull through the last 2 loops on your hook. Drop the colour you are using and put the new colour yarn on your hook and pull the new colour through the last 2 stitches on your hook, leave the old colour yarn at the back of your work ready to pick up again on the next row.



Notes

- ·Patterns written in UK Terms.
- ·Ch1/Ch2 at the beginning of each row DOES NOT count as a stitch.
- •The blanket is made of individual motifs that are then joined together with a whip stitch.
- ·All border rounds are RS Facing.
- ·BLOCKING block motifs every week when completed ready for the final week.
- ·Toadstool squares = Tapestry crochet, written instructions, and chart.
- ·Hedgehog and Flowers squares are worked in the round.
- ·Intarsia/Tapestry Crochet written instructions each stitch is a dc.
- ·Intarsia/Tapestry Crochet chart instructions each square is a dc.
