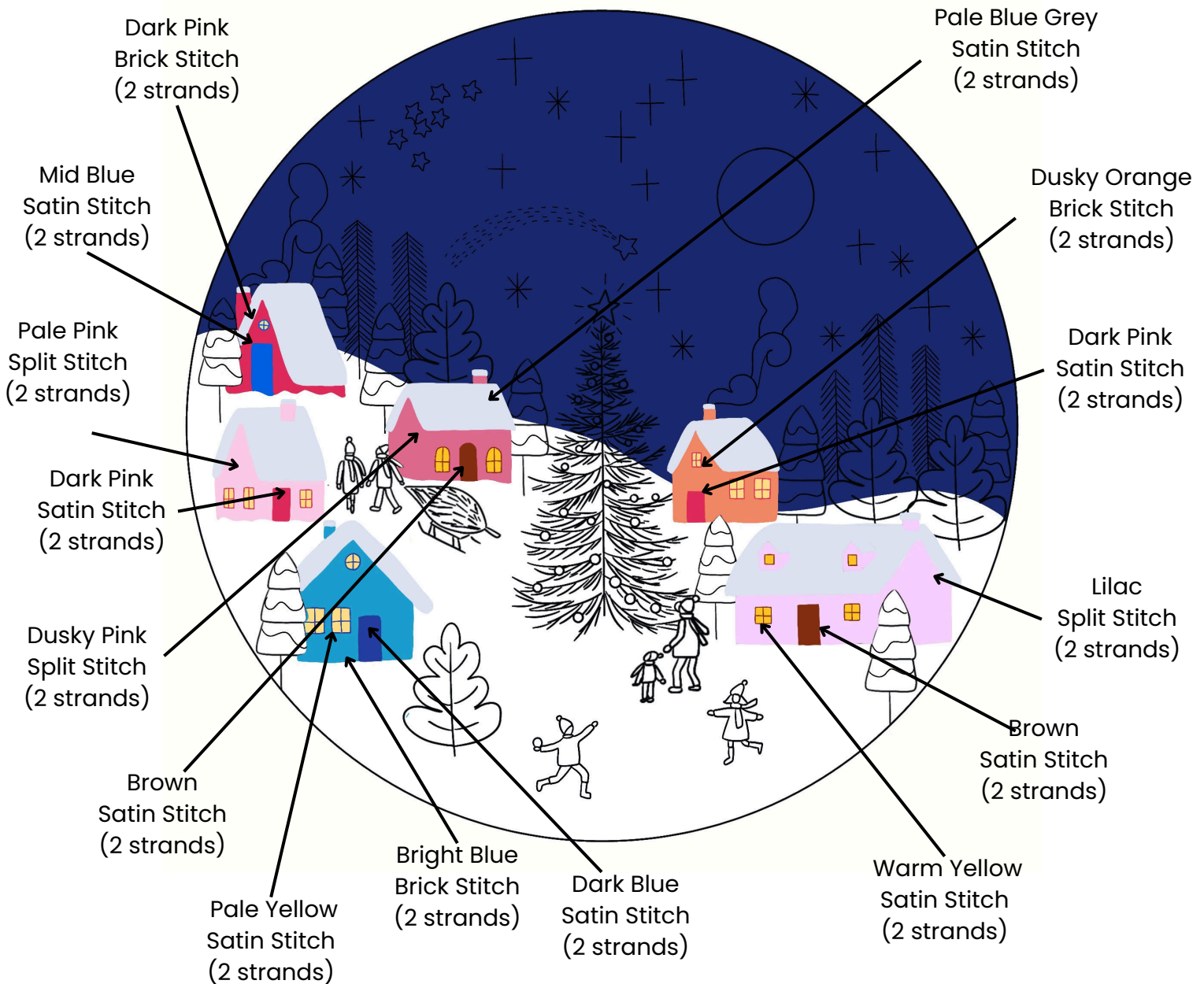


# Week 2

## Stitch Guide: Houses

## Houses



### Top Tips:

1. When satin stitching the rooftops with the pale blue grey thread, carefully align your stitches to match the slope of each roof. This alignment helps create a realistic, clean appearance and ensures that the satin stitch enhances the roof's shape.
2. For stitching houses with split stitch, maintain even spacing and alignment in your vertical and horizontal rows. This consistency helps achieve a neat, structured look and using the same method for each house ensures uniformity in the finished design.
3. When stitching over the layered fabric, make sure to extend your stitches slightly beyond the edges of the fabric layers. This helps blend and cover any raw edges, creating a smooth and polished finish.





# Week 2

## Houses

1. Using 2 strands of pale blue grey thread, **satin stitch** all of the rooftops, aligning the angle of your stitches to follow the slope of each roof. Then, stitch the snow onto the chimneys using the same method.
2. Using 2 strands of either pale pink, mid pink or dusky pink thread, stitch the relevant houses and chimneys (following the colour guide on the previous page) in rows of **split stitch**. For the front of the houses; use vertical rows, and for the sides; use horizontal rows.
3. Next, stitch the remaining three houses in **brick stitch** using 2 strands of either bright blue, dark pink, or dusky orange thread. For the fronts of the houses use vertical rows and use horizontal rows for the sides.
4. Using the guide for reference, fill in all the windows with 2 strands of either warm yellow or pale yellow thread in **satin stitch**.
5. Next, stitch all of the doors using 2 strands of thread in **satin stitch**. Refer to the guide for colour placement.
6. Then, using the same colour you used for the door, but switching to just 1 strand of thread, stitch the window frames using **straight stitch**.



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
